RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Charles Cook, Director of Education of the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy of Cambridge, Massachusetts, has expressed his intent to seek an endorsement from the Virginia Association of Assessing Officers for the expressed purpose of supporting the principle of the World Congress on Computer-Assisted Systems to be held at Harvard Law School, August 1 through August 6, 1982.
