Birthplace of Assessment Law

This session focuses on the Capitol, Capitol Square and the Capitol Square Visitor Center. The Virginia Capitol, the birthplace of assessment law, was designed by Thomas Jefferson and has served as the seat of government since 1788. In preparation for the 400th anniversary of the settlement of Jamestown, Capitol Square became the home of a new Capitol Square Visitors Center and the Capitol was renovated to meet the needs of the twenty-first century. Kathleen Kilpatrick of the Capitol Square Preservation Council will speak about the careful planning and historic preservation consideration given to Capitol Square. Richard Sliwoski, of Virginia Commonwealth University, will provide insight to the recent renovation and improvements. The program will conclude with a four-block walk, led by Mark Greenough of the Capitol Square Visitors Center, to Capitol Square for a tour of the Virginia State Capitol.
